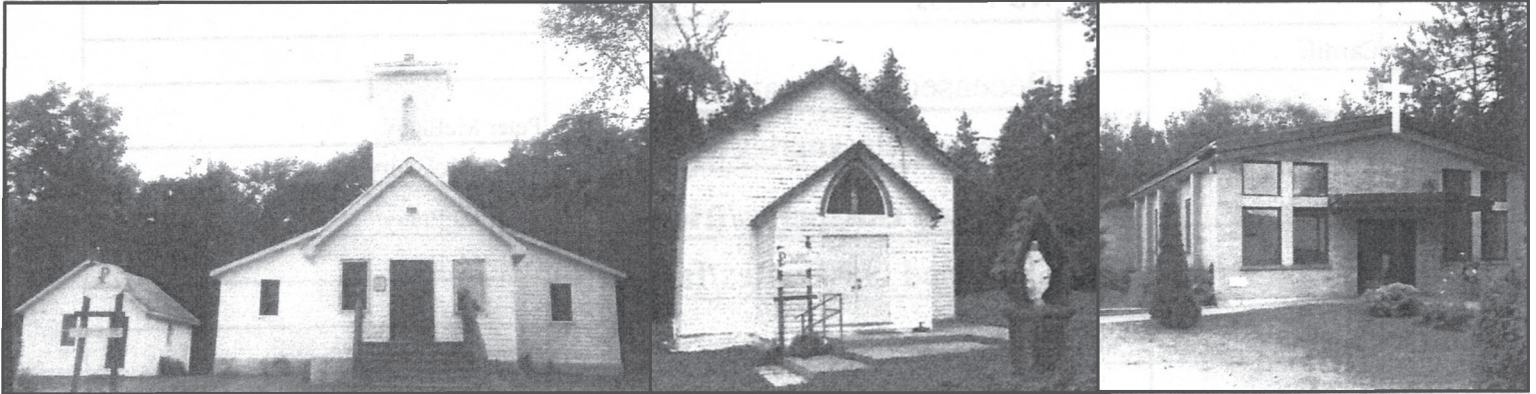

Readings Next Week (May 08, 2022) 4th SUNDAY EASTER

Acts of the Apostles 13:14,43-52 (Paul and Barnabas preach the good news among the Gentiles and are expelled by the Jews.)

Revelation 7:9,14b-17 (John describes his vision of the praises that the holy ones sing to the Lamb.)

John 10:27-30 (Jesus describes his care for his sheep.)

Background on the Gospel Reading

The fourth Sunday of Easter is also called Good Shepherd Sunday. In each of the three lectionary cycles, the Gospel is taken from the tenth chapter of the Gospel of John. This chapter of John's Gospel follows Jesus' healing of the man born blind and the rejection of this miracle by Jewish leaders who question Jesus' authority to heal. Jesus responds to this challenge to his authority by calling himself the Good Shepherd. He is criticizing the Pharisees and other Jewish leaders. Already, the Pharisees and other Jewish leaders are so angered that they attempt to stone and arrest Jesus (see [John 10:31](#) and [10:39](#)). This controversy with the religious leaders continues until Jesus' death.

Set in a moment of tension and conflict in John's Gospel, today's Gospel reading is Jesus' answer to the question, "Are you the Messiah?" Jesus responds by saying, in essence, "If you have to ask, then you are not one of my sheep." Then Jesus asserts his unity with the Father. At the

conclusion of these words, John reports that the Jews intend to stone Jesus for blasphemy, but he escapes arrest.

We may be less familiar with the metaphors of sheep and shepherd than those to whom Jesus spoke. The image of Jesus as Good Shepherd and the community of followers as his sheep has endured over the centuries as a primary image in our faith tradition. Its power to describe the relationship between Jesus and his followers transcends direct experience with sheep. The image speaks to us about the protection, security, and care that shepherds represent for their sheep.

Today's Gospel speaks powerfully about the familiarity and intimacy between Jesus and his disciples, expressed as recognizing and knowing another's voice. Today's Gospel also speaks to the relationship between Jesus and the Father. In the Gospel of John, Jesus identifies so closely with the Father that he tells us that they are one—not just close, but actually one. To know Jesus is to know the Father. Jesus doesn't just bring us closer to the Father, Jesus puts us directly into contact with God the Father, removing all distance between us. Our relationship with Jesus is an invitation to share in the life of God. (Loyola Press)

HOW TO MAKE A HOLY HOUR

The following is a method of prayer proposed by St. Peter Julian Eymard that is rooted in the primary prayers of the Mass.

PRAYER OF ADORATION—I tell Jesus that I love Him: After placing myself in the presence of God, I clear and focus my mind, consider God’s love mercy, goodness and excellence which is the source of all graces and blessings that I have received in my life. I acknowledge and state before God in my own words and in my own way my dependency on Him for everything just like a young child depends on its mother and father for its needs—this is an act of humility. I can also reflect on the humility found in the humanity of Jesus present in the Eucharist and sacrificed in an unbloody manner at the Mass.

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING—I thank Jesus for the blessings He has given me: I then thank God for all the blessings that He has given me; creation, His mercy and grace, Jesus Christ in the Incarnation and the Redemption, the Eucharist and those favors which we have received personally from Him—such as my Catholic faith, my life, my health, my family, my vocation/job and also the favors that I have received either directly from God or from God through others such as the Saints in heaven or people who we know on earth.

PRAYER OF CONTRITION/REPARATION— I acknowledge my sins before Jesus and ask for His forgiveness and mercy: I then ask for forgiveness and also for the grace of deeper contrition/sorrow so that my mortal and venial sins and all their bad effects and dispositions, whether made through commission (what I have done) or omission (what I have failed to do) may be removed. This is an act of reparation (penance) and an act of humility that goes against my own pride and vanity which prevents me from growing in holiness and in true love of God and love of neighbor.

PRAYER OF PETITION/INTERCESSION— I bring Jesus my needs, those of the church and of the world: I then pray for the necessary graces to persevere in faith, hope and love until I die. I can also include a petition for the salvation of my family members, friends, fellow parishioners, co-workers, employer, enemies and the particular needs of the Church and the world. It is in this way that Jesus Himself always prays for all of us and especially at Mass

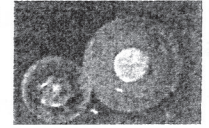
