Readings Next Week (OCTOBER 16, 2022)

First Reading

Exodus 17:8-13

Joshua and the Israelites defeat Amalek with the help of God and his servant, Moses.

Responsorial Psalm

Gospel Reading

Luke 18:1-8

Jesus urges his disciples to pray and not lose heart, for God hears and answers prayers.

Background on the Gospel Reading

This is the first of two parables that Jesus tells in Luke 18 about prayer. (The second will be read at Mass next Sunday.) This first parable is a lesson in persistence in prayer. (Next Sunday's parable will address attitude in prayer.) While the parable seems to present prayer as nagging God for what we want, such a reading misses the point. God is not like the judge in the parable, worn down by requests and coerced to respond. The key is found in the description of the judge as corrupt and unjust. Since God can be neither, we must understand Jesus to be saying that if even an unjust judge responds to the persistence of the widow, how much more so will God listen to our prayers. God truly wants to hear our needs and respond generously. It is the final lament of Jesus that gets to the point of the parable.

The lesson is about the persistence of the one who prays. God wants us to be like the persistent widow, staying in relationship with God, confident that God hears and answers prayers. Then Jesus laments, "Will such faith be found when the Son of Man comes?" In this lament, Jesus notes how easy it can be for us to lose heart.

Funny Isn't It

Funny how much difficulty some have learning a simple gospel well enough to tell others, but how simple it is for the same people to understand and explain gossip about someone.

REFLECTION: "Faith as a way of Knowing" *The Word Among Us*

Faith is a gift from God to which we yield. It is a relationship of trust and surrender to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It cannot be conjured up. Rather, faith grows as we come to understand more deeply who God is and who we are in him.

Christians are meant to walk with confident authority. We are heirs of the kingdom. God has given us a share in his own kingly rule (*Catechism*, 1546). Each one us of has a part in Christ's mission to dismantle the kingdom of darkness and make the kingdom of God present wherever we are. We do that in many ways by serving humbly, by laying down our lives for others, by sharing God's word at every opportunity, by living a holy life in close communion with the Lord so that we emanate the fragrance of Christ, and by dong against sickness and every formof oppression through faith and prayer.

Faith is a way of knowing. The more we know who Christ is—his absolute lordship over the whole universe, his victory over sin and death won on the cross, his unconditional love for every human being—the more faith we have. That faith is what enables us to pray against sickness and infirmity with confident authority that the Lord want us to have—and that we can have—every time we pray for healing.

An Italian mystic and founder of the Passionist Order, St. Paul of the Cross was born Paolo Francesco Danei on January 3, 1694,in Ovada, Genoa, northern Italy.

The second of 16 children, only five of his siblings survived infancy. Though he lived until age 81, death and the uncertainty of life were a large part of his early life.

Even as a young man, he became known for his piety and devotion to the Mass. A mystic, he received a vision of himself in his Passionist habit and thus was inspired to found the Congregation of Discalced Clerks of the Holy Cross and Passion of Our Lord, also known as the Passionists, a congregation that would honour the Passion of Jesus. In November 1720, the local bishop vested him with the habit that had been shown to him in his vision, the same that the Passionists continue to wear.

Paul was a tireless missionary of Italy for the next 50 years, often traveling barefoot. He carried a large crucifix with him everywhere he traveled and thus became known as "Paul of the Cross." He was constantly undergoing extraordinary sacrifices and penances for the conversion of sinners. Even as he received much from God, he counted himself as a useless servant and a great sinner. His feast day in October 16.

"The passion of Jesus is a sea of sorrows, but it is also an ocean of love. Ask the Lord to teach you to fish in this ocean. Dive into its depths. No matter how deep you go, you will never reach the bottom."

"Celebrate the feast of Christmas every day, even every moment in the interior temple of your spirit, remaining like a baby in the bosom of the heavenly Father, where you will be reborn each moment in the Divine Word, Jesus Christ."

"Entrust yourself entirely to God. Hi is a father, and a most loving father at that."
