Readings Next Week (OCTOBER 23, 2022)

First Reading

Sirach 35:12-14,16-18

God hears the prayer of the poor.

Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 34:2-3,17-18,19, 23

The Lord hears and answers the cry of the poor.

Second Reading

2 Timothy 4:6-8,16-18

Paul perseveres in faith, confident that God will rescue him.

Gospel Reading

Luke 18:9-14

Jesus tells the parable of the proud Pharisee who prayed from his self-importance and the tax collector who prayed humbly.

Background on the Gospel Reading

The second parable that Jesus tells in Luke 18 addresses attitude in prayer. In contrasting the prayer of the Pharisee with the prayer of the tax collector, Jesus teaches his disciples to pray in humility before God. Jesus again surprises his listeners by showing the tax collector as the example of faith, rather than the Pharisee. Remember that Pharisees were members of a sect of Judaism active in Jesus' time. They taught an oral interpretation of the Law of Moses as the basis for Jewish piety. If anyone would be a model for prayer, a Pharisee was a likely candidate. In contrast, Jesus offers the tax collector as a model for prayer. Tax collectors were collaborators with the Roman authorities in a system that allowed the tax collectors to line their own pockets by charging in excess of the defined taxes. Yet, in

this parable, Jesus offers the humility of the tax collector as a model for the prayer of a disciple. The parable reminds us that when we pray, we must remember our need for God in our lives. If we are too full of ourselves, there is too little room for God's grace to work in us.

World Food Day – October 16

A World Food Day has been promoted by the Food and Agriculture Organization since 1981. The Church is concerned about the issue of hunger in the world, remembering the words of the Son of Man on the last judgment of the nations, "...I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink ...” (Mt. 25.25)

Food Waste

- ◆ 2.3 million tons of food wasted yearly in Canada cost in excess of \$21 billion
- ◆ \$200 billion is spent on food that won't be eaten
- ◆ Over 800 million people are suffering from severe malnutrition
- ◆ Food waste uses up to 21% of fresh water, 19% of our fertilizer, 21% of landfill volume
- ◆ If 25% of the food lost or wasted globally was saved, it would be enough to feed 850 million people around the world

REFLECTION: "When Prayer is Not Answered"
The Word Among Us

If we pray with confident faith, how then, should we respond when our prayers for healing, either for ourselves or for someone else, seem to have no effect? The Gospels teach us the appropriate response. Jesus' parable of the unjust judge puts to rest any notion that we should give up asking if our prayers are not answered (Luke 18:1-8).

Jesus invites us to be persistent and unrelenting in our prayers. God is infinite; there is no limit to the love and grace he longs to lavish on his children, if only we ask. "He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, will he not also give us all things with him?" (Romans 8:32)

It is also true, however that as we persist in prayer, the Lord will gradually begin to move in our hearts. Sometimes he changes our desires to become more closely aligned with his. Over time he may even lead us to pray in a different way.

Even when it seems nothing is happening in response to our prayer, the Lord may still be accomplishing immense, though unseen, changes. Often there are hidden spiritual or psychological mountains that need to be removed. As we persevere in prayer, the Lord may remove these obstacles little by little. We should never yield to a spirit of hopelessness but, rather, as Paul counseled, "Pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances" (1 Thesalonians 5:17-18).

St. John Paul II, Pope
(1920 - 2005)

Born Karol J. Wojtyla in Wadowice, Poland, on May 18, 1920, John Paul II was elected pope in October 1978, the first non-Italian pope in more than 40 years. "Open wide the doors to Christ," he proclaimed at his installation. He traveled the world in his nearly three decades as pope, becoming the most traveled pope in history.

Living through Nazi occupation, and subsequently communism, he became a stalwart for defending the faith in the face of such modern evils. Beginning in 1942, he studied for the priesthood in secret due to the Nazi occupation. He was ordained to the priesthood in Krakow in 1946. Communist officials allowed Fr. Wojtyla to be appointed auxiliary bishop of Krakow in 1958, considering him a harmless intellectual. Especially dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, he credits her with saving his life following an assassination attempt in 1981. He founded World Youth Day and was especially beloved by the youth of his time. Even judging by the world's standards, Pope John Paul II was "great." He was a charismatic leader, an important thinker, and a history-changing political force. But perhaps in no more profound area of life did he exemplify sanctity than through his own suffering late in his life. As Pope John Paul II aged, he took the public on his journey of suffering as he battled Parkinson's disease for years prior to his death.

"There is no evil to be faced that Christ does not face with us. There is no enemy that Christ has not already conquered. There is no cross to bear that Christ has not already borne for us."

"Christ does not explain in the abstract the reasons for suffering, but before all else he says: 'Follow me! Come! Take part through your suffering in this work of saving the world.'"

"Courageously follow th path of personal holiness and diligently nourish yourselves with the word of God and the Eucharist."

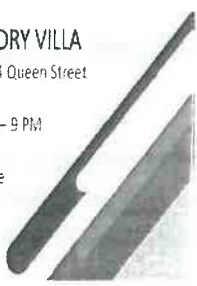
