

Readings Next Week (NOV. 20, 2022) FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE 2 Samuel 5:1-3

David is anointed king.

Colossians 1:12-20

Hymn to Jesus as the first-born of all creation.

Luke 23:35-43

Jesus is crucified under the title King of the Jews.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Today as a Church, we conclude our liturgical year and celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. The Gospel we proclaim shows the great mystery of our faith: In the moment of his crucifixion, Jesus is shown to be King and Savior of all.

Luke's Gospel has been loaded with surprises: the poor are rich, sinners find salvation, the Kingdom of God is found in our midst. Here we see the greatest surprise of all. We are confronted with the crucified Jesus, whom faith tells us is King and Savior of all. The irony is that the inscription placed on the cross, perhaps in mockery, contains the profoundest of truth. As the leaders jeer, the thief crucified by his side recognizes Jesus as Messiah and King, and finds salvation.

Jesus is King, but not the kind of king we might have imagined or expected. His kingship was hidden from many of his contemporaries, but those who had the eyes of faith were able to see. As modern disciples of Jesus, we, too, struggle at times to recognize Jesus as

King. Today's Gospel invites us to make our own judgment. With eyes of faith, we, too, recognize that Jesus, the crucified One, is indeed King and Savior of all. (Loyola Press)

EVANGELIZATION MEANS BEING A SIGN OF GOD'S PRESENCE

VISUALIZE GOD'S PRESENCE. One way to enter into evangelizing prayer is by meditating with a photograph of a person, or by closing your eyes and imagining Jesus approaching him or her. Notice the affection Jesus has for the person and imagine them embracing. Describe his or her need, and then listen for what Jesus might say. Pray in this way, being careful to also thank Jesus for the big and the small ways that he is already active in this person's life.

Another way to pray is to imagine this person inside a building, perhaps in his or her home. Then imagine Jesus knocking at the front door, a door without an outside knob. Is the door clocked or jammed shut? Is it rusted? Is it too heavy? Then imagine that something remarkable happens. All of a sudden, the condition of the door doesn't matter. As you pray, Jesus passes right through the door and puts his arms around this person. And the strength of his love gives him or her the confidence and the inspiration to accept Jesus and the grace of his salvation. To be continued)
